Epistle Lesson Romans 8:18-25 "For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us. For the earnest expectation of the creation eagerly waits for the revealing of the sons of God. For the creation was subjected to futility, not willingly, but because of Him who subjected it in hope; because the creation itself also will be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. <u>IT IS WELL WITH MY SOUL</u> Horatio Spafford was a successful attorney and real estate investor who lost a fortune in the great Chicago fire of 1871. He also lost his four-year-old son to scarlet fever.

Thinking a vacation would do his family some good, he sent his wife and four daughters on a ship to England. While crossing the Atlantic, the ship was involved in a terrible collision and sank. 200 people lost their lives, including all four of Horatio Spafford's daughters. His wife, Anna, survived the tragedy. Upon arriving in England, she sent the famous telegram to her husband: "Saved alone. What shall I do?"

Horatio immediately set sail for England. When he was told that they were passing the place where his daughters died, he wrote the words of this famous hymn of faith.
