

Epistle Lesson Romans 7:14-20 For we know that the law is spiritual, but I am carnal, sold under sin. For what I am doing, I do not understand. For what I will to do, that I do not practice; but what I hate, that I do. If, then, I do what I will not to do, I agree with the law that it is good. But now, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me. For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh) nothing good dwells; for to will is present with me, but how to perform what is good I do not find. For the good that I will to do, I do not do; but the evil I will not to do, that I practice. Now if I do what I will not to do, it is no longer I who do it, but sin that dwells in me.

Gospel Lesson Mark 7:1-13 Then the Pharisees and some of the scribes came together to Him, having come from Jerusalem. Now when they saw some of His disciples eat bread with defiled, that is, with unwashed hands, they found fault. For the Pharisees and all the Jews do not eat unless they wash their hands in a special way, holding the tradition of the elders. When they come from the marketplace, they do not eat unless they wash. And there are many other things which they have received and hold, like the washing of cups, pitchers, copper vessels, and couches.

Then the Pharisees and scribes asked Him, "Why do Your disciples not walk according to the tradition of the elders, but eat bread with unwashed hands?"

He answered and said to them, "Well did Isaiah prophesy of you hypocrites, as it is written: 'This people honors Me with their lips, But their heart is far from Me. And in vain they worship Me, Teaching as doctrines the commandments of men.'

For laying aside the commandment of God, you hold the tradition of men the washing of pitchers and cups, and many other such things you do."

He said to them, "All too well you reject the commandment of God, that you may keep your tradition. For Moses said, 'Honor your father and your mother'; and, 'He who curses father or mother, let him be put to death.' But you say, 'If a man says to his father or mother, "Whatever profit you might have received from me is Corban"—' (that is, a gift to God), then you no longer let him do anything for his father or his mother, making the word of God of no effect through your tradition which you have handed down. And many such things you do."

Sermon Isaiah 29:11-19 [EHV] For you this whole vision has become like the words of a sealed scroll. If you give it to someone who can read, and you say, "Read this, please," he will say, "I can't. It is sealed." And if you give it to someone who cannot read, and you say, "Read this, please," he will say, "I can't read."

The Lord says:

These people approach Me with their words, and they honor Me with their lips, but their hearts are far from Me. Their worship of Me is nothing but commandments taught by men. So watch how I will continue to amaze these people with amazing, extraordinary things. The wisdom of the wise will perish, and the intelligence of the intelligent will be hidden. Woe to those who try to hide their plans from the Lord. Their deeds are done in darkness, and they think that no one sees them or knows what they are doing. You turn things upside down! Should the Potter be treated like clay? Should the thing that was made say to its Maker, "You didn't make me"?

Isn't it true that in a very short time Lebanon will be turned into a fertile field, and the fertile field will seem like a forest? On that day, the deaf will hear the words from a book, and out of gloom and darkness the eyes of the blind will see. The humble will rejoice in the Lord once again, and the poor will delight in the Holy One of Israel.
