Steven Wayne Sumey was born to Wayne Sumey and Violet nee Dahl on June 7, 1954 in Minneapolis, MN. He grew up in Plymouth and attended Wayzata High School, where he lettered in football, basketball, and He was also a 3-year member of the Minnesota All-State baseball. Symphony Orchestra. He went on to study Chemistry at St. Olaf College, where he played in the orchestra and on the baseball team. As a pitcher. he was awarded team MVP, winning the championship his senior year in 1976. He attended Medical School at the University of Minnesota and participated in the Rural Association Training Program in Windom, where he met a young nurse and his future wife. After graduating from Medical School in 1980, he began a 3-year Family Practice Residency in Duluth, MN. Upon completion, the couple returned to Windom where he practiced for 4 vears. In 1987, they moved to Fairmont, where he practiced at the Fairmont Medical Center and Smart Clinic until 2018, famously creating animal balloons for well-behaved pediatric patients. In Fairmont, he and his wife restored a Victorian home (circa 1900), where they raised their 5 children. When not caring for patients and his young family, he continued to play baseball for the Windom Pirates, and later, the Fairmont Martins, until age 37. He enjoyed traveling with family and friends. For many years, he was the caregiver for his elderly parents and his younger brother who had suffered a traumatic brain injury. A long-suffering Minnesota sports fan, he also enjoyed golf, auto repair, furniture restoration building custom dollhouses, and spending time with his family and 10 grandchildren.

He became a member of St. John's Lutheran Church in 1980. Over the past 44 years, he served as congregational Chairman, Elder, and Chair of the Mission Society. For years, he taught Advanced Bible History to grades 6-8th. Despite distance and travel conditions, he and his wife rarely missed a service. He also conducted services when the pastor was out of town.

Dr. Sumey enjoyed good health for most of his life. On September 3, he went to the clinic, expecting them to find kidney stones. Instead, he learned that there was a mass on his pancreas and liver. Treatment was not a viable option, yet his attitude and faith did not change. Surrounded by family, he was crowned with eternal glory at the age of 70 years, 2 months, and 17 days.

He was preceded in death by his parents, his sister Susan, his brother Jon, his father-in-law Herman Eigenberg, and his brother-in-law Bruce Iverson.
