

QUARTERLY MEETING The following were addressed and/or approved at the October 24 meeting:

- 1. <u>Membership</u>. Christine Bass was released from membership as a result of her leaving her family and moving to Florida. She excluded herself from admonition by refusing to speak with the pastor and/or Elders. Mike De-Wall was released at his request. The Kent Rozelle family also requested a release (They live in the Oklahoma City area).
- 2. <u>Trustees</u>. The upstairs carpeting in the parsonage will be replaced at a cost of \$5,000. New kitchen appliances will be purchased, including a stove, refrigerator, and dishwasher.
- 3. <u>Treasurer's Report</u>. While there is about \$14,000 in the General Fund, we are currently behind on our Cooperative Budget Plan projection (the amount we give for synodical purposes) by \$1,700. We will need to start paying property tax on the teacherage at the cost of \$1,900 per year.
- 4. <u>Fall Schedule</u>. The Thanksgiving Service will be held at 9:30 a.m. on November 25. There will be three midweek Advent Services. The Children's Christmas Eve Service will be held at 6:30 p.m. The Christmas Day Festival Service will be held at 9:30 a.m. A New Year's Eve Service will be held at 7:00 p.m. The Election Meeting will be held on December 8. Officers will be installed on Sunday, January 5. The Annual Meeting will be held on January 19. Adapted from the official minutes, Bruce Eigenberg, Secretary
