

Now when the king lived in his house and the LORD had given him rest from all his

surrounding enemies, ² the king said to Nathan the prophet, "See now, I dwell in a house of cedar, but the ark of God dwells in a tent." ³ And Nathan said to the king, "Go, do all that is in your heart, for the LORD is with you." ⁴ But that same night the word of the LORD came to Nathan, ⁵ "Go and tell my servant David, 'Thus says the LORD: Would you build me a house to dwell in? ⁶ I have not lived in a house since the day I brought up the people of Israel from Egypt to this day, but I

have been moving about in a tent for my dwelling. 7 In all places where I have moved with all the people of Israel, did I speak a word with any of the judges of Israel, whom I commanded to shepherd my people Israel, saying, "Why have you not built me a house of cedar?" 8 Now, therefore, thus you shall say to my servant David, 'Thus says the LORD of hosts, I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, that you should be prince over my people Israel. 9 And I have been with you wherever you went and have cut off all your enemies from before you. And I will make for you a great name, like the name of the great ones of the earth. 10 And I will appoint a place for my people Israel and will plant them, so that they may dwell in their own place and be disturbed no more. And violent men shall afflict them no more, as formerly, 11 from the time that I appointed judges over my people Israel. And I will give you rest from all your enemies. Moreover, the LORD declares to you that the LORD will make you a house. 12 When your days are fulfilled and you lie down with your fathers, I will raise up your offspring after you, who shall come from your body, and I will establish his kingdom. 13 He shall build a house for my name, and I will establish the throne of his kingdom forever. 14 I will be to him a father, and he shall be to me a son. When he commits iniquity, I will discipline him with the rod of men, with the stripes of the sons of men, 15 but my steadfast love will not depart from him, as I took it from Saul, whom I put away from before you. 16 And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before me. Your throne shall be established forever."

But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born

under the law, ⁵ to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. ⁶ And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" ⁷ So you are no longer a slave, but a son, and if a son, then an heir through God.

Luke 2:22-35

And when the time came for their purification according to the Law of Moses, they

brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³ (as it is written in the Law of the Lord, "Every male who first opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord") 24 and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the Law of the Lord, "a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons." ²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem, whose name was Simeon, and this man was righteous and devout, waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. ²⁶ And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. 27 And he came in the Spirit into the temple, and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him according to the custom of the Law, ²⁸ he took him up in his arms and blessed God and said, ²⁹ "Lord, now you are letting your servant depart in peace, according to your word; 30 for my eyes have seen your salvation 31 that you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, 32 a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel." ³³ And his father and his mother marveled at what was said about him. ³⁴ And Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is appointed for the fall and rising of many in Israel, and for a sign that is opposed ³⁵ (and a sword will pierce through your own soul also), so that thoughts from many hearts may be revealed."

Devotion: The Christmas Miracle

Have you experienced a Christmas miracle? Many people look for something out of the ordinary, something miraculous to set apart Christmas from every other time of the year.

Movies portray people sacrificing for others, angels intervening in everyday life, and expressions of generosity and good will coming from unexpected sources. Expectations build for great and inspirational things.

It's not all fiction. There have been some amazing "miracles" at Christmastime. History records the Christmas truce of 1914 when German and allied troops entrenched against each other put down their weapons, exchanged gifts, and sang carols. Maybe you'll receive your own little "miracle" this year!

But if all a Christmas miracle means is some temporary surprise blessing, we're missing the point. The real Christmas miracle is something so out of the ordinary and so far beyond human expectation that only God Himself could bring it about. "No eye has seen, no ear has heard, no mind has conceived what God has prepared for those who love him" (1 Cor. 2:9). We could imagine that God might send His angels to earth, but who would ever dare to dream that God Himself, the Maker of heaven and earth, would even consider entering His creation, especially when humankind by nature wants nothing to do with Him?

Realistically, why would God care about what happens to you and me when we are so small and insignificant in the big picture? Yet He did care. He cared so much about every human being that He became one of us. "But when the time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under law, to redeem those under law, that we might receive the full rights of sons" (Gal. 4:4-5).

The Son of God became man to do in our behalf what we could never hope to do for ourselves. He came to be holy that we might be counted as righteous before the Father. He came to assume the blame for all our many faults and failings. The real Christmas miracle is that the Baby in the manger is the Son of God Himself who purely out of divine love came to give Himself for us that we might be called children of God and heirs of heaven.

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions

"Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path."
-Psalm 119:105

Mon Luke 2:22-32 Jesus has been born under the law of Moses, and His parents soon take Him to the temple to fulfill the rites of purification and presentation. The Spirit uses this opportunity to bless Simeon and those who hear him.

Tues Hebrews 3:1-6 Jesus deserves greater glory than Moses, just as the builder deserves greater glory than the house. Moses was faithful as "servant in God's house," but Jesus is faithful as "Son over God's house."

Wed Luke 4:16-21 Isaiah prophesied of the Messiah's time, a wonderful time of good news, spiritual freedom, and recovery, the year of the Lord's favor (v19). With Jesus that time has come, also in 2025 (v21)!

Thurs Isaiah 12:1-6 As we journey forth into another calendar year, we look back and thank God for the forgiveness that brings salvation and the wondrous things that He has done for the human race.

Fri Psalm 2:1-6 While it may seem fearful when the nations rage, the Lord, our God, has no fear of them. He has installed His King on Mount Zion in spite of all opposition!

Sat Psalm 2:7-12 The Son of God towers above all human opposition, and the mighty ones of this world would do well to honor Him. "How blessed are all who take refuge in Him" (v12)!
