When he had entered Capernaum, a centurion came forward to him,

appealing to him, ⁶ "Lord, my servant is lying paralyzed at home, suffering terribly." 7 And he said to him, "I will come and heal him." ⁸ But the centurion replied, "Lord, I am not worthy to have you come under my roof, but only say the word, and my servant will be healed. 9 For I too am a man under authority, with soldiers under me. And I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes, and to another, 'Come,' and he comes, and to my servant, 'Do this,' and he does it." ¹⁰ When Jesus heard this, he marveled and said to those who followed him, "Truly, I tell you, with no one in Israel have I found such faith. ¹¹ I tell you, many will come from east and west and recline at table with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob in the kingdom of heaven, ¹² while the sons of the kingdom will be thrown into the outer darkness. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." ¹³ And to the centurion Jesus said, "Go; let it be done for you as you have believed." And the servant was healed at that very moment.

meet the bridegroom.² Five of them were foolish, and five were wise. ³ For when the foolish took their lamps, they took no oil with them, ⁴ but the wise took flasks of oil with their lamps. ⁵ As the bridegroom was delayed, they all became drowsy and slept. ⁶ But at midnight there was a cry, 'Here is the bridegroom! Come out to meet him.' 7 Then all those virgins rose and trimmed their lamps. ⁸ And the foolish said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' ⁹ But the wise answered, saying, 'Since there will not be enough for us and for you, go rather to the dealers and buy for yourselves.' ¹⁰ And while they were going to buy, the bridegroom came, and those who were ready went in with him to the marriage feast, and the door was shut. ¹¹ Afterward the other virgins came also, saying, 'Lord, lord, open to us.' ¹² But he answered, 'Truly, I say to you, I do not know you.' ¹³ Watch therefore, for you know neither the day nor the hour.

▶ Lord God, heavenly Father, our times are in Your hands. This is a comforting truth as we remember our brothers and sisters in Christ whom You have abundantly blessed by taking them from this world of sin and sorrow to be with You for eternity. Teach Us to Number Our Days

Have you made your New Year's resolutions? According to one survey, the top three resolutions for 2025 are saving money, reducing stress, and spending less time on social media. Maybe you've decided on something else like exercising more or eating better. There are all kinds of worthwhile goals to pursue, and the beginning of a new year may be just the incentive we need to put out the effort. We want to make the most of the days and months ahead.

In Psalm 90 Moses made a type of resolution too. It's in the form of a prayer seeking God's help to make it happen. In v. 12 he wrote, "Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom." There are all kinds of resolutions which make a lot of sense from a worldly point of view. But Moses was looking for something far more important—real wisdom. It is not just knowing what is good for this life, but what has eternal importance and meaning. That wisdom comes only from God. "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom" (Prov. 9:10). The most important thing we can do in the new year is to use it to prepare for eternity. The best resolution we can make is to "seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness" (Matt. 6:33).

It would be fitting to begin each day asking that the Lord would "teach us to number our days." May we view them as a time of grace in which to take to heart what Scripture says about our sinful condition, and then to seek Jesus as the wise men did in order to worship him as the Son of God and Savior. May the Spirit through the message of Christ grant us godly resolve and true wisdom for the year ahead.

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
